## The Cannes OPENER

Welcome to Holy Trinity, we're delighted you could join us and we extend a warm welcome to any visitors worshipping with us. Our service at 9:00am is Holy Communion and at 10:30am Morning Prayer which will be live-streamed as usual via Facebook and YouTube.

There's a Sunday Club for the young people so they leave after the Children's talk.

We continue our sermon series on the life of Abraham.

Genesis 17 describes God's appearance to Abram, who is now 99 years old. Many years have passed since God first promised to make Abram a great nation and to give to him and to his descendants the land of Canaan. During that time, Abram and his large company have lived in different parts of the region. He has grown quite wealthy, and God has appeared to him several more times to restate and expand on the initial covenant promises. In our passage today, God arrives to change Abram's name to Abraham, to confirm the covenant promises, and to command Abraham. He is to circumcise every male in his household as a sign of the covenant. Then the big news: within a year, Abraham's wife—now renamed Sarah—would bear Abraham a son. This long-awaited son would be the one through whom God would keep all of His promises to Abraham.
